# 2. Annual report of the Members of the Vestry

### Introduction

The Vestry is pleased to present the annual accounts of All Saints for the year to 30 September 2024.

We are a small, friendly congregation whose objective is to advance the mission of the Christian Church in Lockerbie and the surrounding district through worship, service and fellowship. We aim to do this through supporting existing church members, welcoming new members and visitors, working closely with our sister Church, St John the Evangelist in Moffat, and in cooperation with the Galloway Region, the Diocese, and where the opportunity arises, with the members of other denominations in our area.

The Church is fully accessible and has disabled toilet facilities, a hearing loop system, a sound system, a 65" television screen and equipment for screening services live.

This annual report and accounts present a summary of our financial activities during the year and give an overview of the general activities which have taken place in the life of the Church in the past year.

## **Activities and Achievements**

We have continued with our weekly Eucharist service at 11.15am each Sunday. Attendances have been slowly declining over many years, currently around 15 – 20 normally attend. However others view the service online. Apart from the summer months, a monthly Taize service is held and this is well attended by people of all denominations.

During the year we have held two Craft Fayres, a coffee morning, a carol concert and a silent auction/afternoon tea. These events were all well supported and raised much needed funds.

Over the Christmas Season we again illuminated the Church and had a nativity scene in the grounds which is much admired by the local community. As part of Churches Together in Lockerbie we held our annual Community Carols event in the Town Hall.

We have supported the Salvation Army food bank in Lockerbie and prior to Christmas we filled 30 shoe boxes for the Blythswood Care annual appeal.

We were sorry when our Rector announced that he was leaving to take up a similar post in Forfar and Kirriemuir. He left at the end of June and since then our members have rallied round to fill the gap left by his departure. The process of finding a replacement is at an early stage. We were very pleased to welcome Rev'd John Stevenson as interim Priest in Charge and are grateful to him and other clergy and lay people who are keeping our worship going.

We are particularly fortunate that one of our members, Christian Taylor, has been authorised as a worship leader. He can administer Communion using Reserved Sacrament and is now preparing and delivering sermons.

We held our usual two joint Vestry meetings with St John's Moffat to discuss items of mutual interest. We have also had two additional joint Vestry meetings to start the recruitment process for a new Rector.

As part of the ongoing maintenance programme for the buildings and grounds, some of the electrical system has been upgraded, and specialist tree surgeons have undertaken significant works to remove low and overhanging branches, and removal of dead limbs from the avenue of mature lime trees.

A generous donation from a member will enable us to have all the broken window panes repaired in the forthcoming year.

### Financial Performance

Receipts during the year exceeded payments by £12,279. The surplus arose from a number of exceptional items – a saving of £4k on our budgeted contribution to the Ministry Account following the departure of the Rector, a donation of £3k and a grant of £500 towards expenditure which will be incurred in the following year, increased proceeds from fundraising events and reduced energy costs.

### Reserves

Due to the surplus achieved and a significant increase in the market value of our investments our reserves have increased by £27,350 during the year. This is a much higher reserve than would normally be expected but it generates almost £9k per annum in dividends and interest so the Vestry considers that in order to secure the long term future of All Saints against a national trend of falling Church attendance, it is essential to strive to maintain our reserves.

### Structure, Governance and Management

All Saints' is an unincorporated association, governed by a constitution which was last amended in 2004. As a member congregation of the United Diocese of Glasgow & Galloway in the Scottish Episcopal Church, it is also governed by Canon Law of the Scottish Episcopal Church. The management team of the Church is known as the Vestry. For the purposes of charity law, the members of the Vestry are the Charity Trustees of the Church.

Apart from the Rector and the Rector's Warden, the other Vestry members are elected by the congregation in annual meeting. The Lay Representative and the People's Warden are elected annually whilst at least two of the ordinary Vestry members must retire annually but are eligible for re-election.. New Vestry members are given guidance outlining their role and responsibilities according to their individual needs. The treasurer regularly updates other members of the Vestry on relevant changes in legislation and best practice relating to charities.

## Vestry Responsibilities

The Vestry are responsible for managing and safeguarding the assets of the Church and assisting the Rector in matters affecting the spiritual welfare of the congregation. They are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records and ensuring that the accounts are prepared in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 as amended. The Vestry regularly considers the risks faced by All Saints' and ensures that appropriate risk management procedures are in place to mitigate those risks.

# Relationship with Diocese and Province

All Saints' is supported by the Diocese and the Province through the pastoral oversight of the Bishop and central support functions provided at Diocesan level. The Church is represented at Diocesan level by the Rector and the Lay Representative. As a member of the Scottish Episcopal Church All Saints' has an obligation to contribute to the costs of the Diocese and the Province through payment of an annual quota. This amount is based on the relative level of our income in comparison with other Churches in the Diocese and the Province.

#### Conclusion

The members of the Vestry would like to thank all those who contribute their time, energy and money so generously to ensure the continuation and development of All Saints' as a centre of worship and an important part of the Christian life of the Lockerbie District. The Vestry look forward to the appointment of a new Rector who can grow the congregation and make All Saints' a happy place to which people will want to come.

# 3. Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of All Saints Episcopal Church, Lockerbie

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30th September 2024 as set out on pages 5 to 7.

# Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner.

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006as amended. ### 6. Notes to the Accounts

# 1. Accounting Policies

## Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis. They consist of a summary of all moneys received and paid via the bank and in cash during the financial year, along with a statement of balances. No adjustments have been made for any income due but not received, nor for any expenses incurred but not yet paid at the year end. Except for investments fixed assets are not capitalised.

#### Restricted Funds

All funds are unrestricted with the exception of the small balance of £54 remaining from donations received in 2022 for Ukrainian refugees, a donation of £3k received in the current year for Church maintenance and a grant of £500 towards the cost of the quinquennial inspection.

#### Joint Costs

All Saints' Lockerbie and St John's Moffat formed a new joint charge and appointed a full time Rector with effect from 9 August 2019. All ministry costs are detailed in the appendix and are currently shared on the basis of 55% from St John's and 45% from All Saints'.

## Buildings

Neither the Church nor the rectory is included in the statement of balances. The Vestry believe that it is not possible to place an accurate market value on the Church. Insurance value for the Rectory is £456,651. For the Church there is a loss limit of £6.65 million but the valuation determined by the surveyor in 2019 was £2,610,000 for building and contents.
